SI Woodland at the First Friday Art Walk



YoloArts is dedicated to cultivating and enriching lives through the arts. A non-profit, YoloArts partners with businesses, schools, and other non-profits to build opportunities for artists, community members, and children to participate in and enjoy a variety of art forms.

Current programs funded and facilitated by YoloArts include:

Art education programs in schools throughout Yolo County serving over 2200 students per year through programs such as Poetry Out Loud at Esparto High School; classroom and school mural programs in four different districts and the Artist in Schools program which provides in-depth ceramic art education for students K-12th grade.

Art and Ag program founded by YoloArts to cultivate relationships between artists, farmers, and the community to raise awareness of the importance of preserving our farmland and the visual arts in Yolo County. Art and Ag has gained national recognition for Yolo County and has been recognized as a model program for using the arts to increase community vibrancy.

First Friday Art Walk showcases local and regional artists' works in a variety of mediums on display at Gallery 625 and downtown businesses from 5:30 pm to 9:00 pm on the first Friday of each month. In addition to visual arts, music, dance, and performance art take place encouraging participation by the community. In addition, YoloArts invites other community non-profit organizations, such as Soroptimist International of Woodland, to participate in the First Friday Art Walk by showcasing their organization's mission and programs.

The Community Mandala Project is an offshoot of the Art and Ag program and delivers a hands-on approach to art for the residents of Yolo County with the guidance of professional artists.

Funds to support programs come from a variety of sources including grants, fundraisers, membership, and matching funds from school districts participating in the art education programs.

The sixth annual "Live Your Dream" Hike took place on April 12, 2014. This year we had the privilege of taking 24 young women on the 5-mile hike which started from Muir Woods National Park and ended at Stinson Beach.

This hike is more than just a walk in the park and lunch at the beach. In addition to being physically challenging it is also a day of personal growth. Our main purpose is not only to educate these young women, but also to empower them to take control of their own lives, be responsible for their own actions, and believe in themselves and their dreams.

Program coordinator BriAnne Dewberry mentioned, "The hard work put in by the committee members and the eagerness of the young women in our community to participate made this another successful year of hiking. I am already looking forward to next year!"

This years activities included an icebreaker game for the bus ride up, a scavenger hunt during the hike, and a pop quiz for the bus ride home (there was even a small prize for the winner). At the halfway point of the hike we took a break and had a group discussion and activity which was focused on what it means to have a healthy body image and how the media portrays the "ideal body type".

The Live Your Dream campaign inspires women and girls to live their dreams and encourages them to pass on their good fortune to others. The campaign celebrates the unique power and accomplishments of women and girls. When women help themselves and one another, amazing things can happen. The Live your Dream Campaign is an empowering women's network and one of the leading online women support groups and sources of inspiration for women and girls. The mission of Live Your Dream Campaign is to enhance the life of women and girls, in local communities and all over the world.





SI Woodland Scholarships and Awards 2014

In June we will be hosting our annual Live Your Dream Luncheon to honor the recipients of our various scholarships and awards.



The Soroptimist Ruby Award honors women who have worked to improve the lives of women and girls through their professional and/or volunteer work. Soroptimist International of Woodland honors Piper Gianola with the Ruby Award. Piper's work exemplifies this extraordinary commitment: she retired in 2011 to devote herself full time to the work of the organization she founded, goal4.org. Goal 4's work and name is based on the fourth United Nations Millennium Development Goal, which is to reduce under-five mortality. Piper's organization has focused on Sega, Kenya, a cluster of villages in a region of Kenya which has suffered the highest child mortality rates in the country. Goal4.org is currently focused on addressing the top five causes of infant mortality in Kenya: Lack of Neonatal care, Diarrheal Disease, Pneumonia, Malaria, and Malnutrition. Each of their programs is focused on either prevention or diagnosis and treatment. Goal4.org will receive a \$1,000 donation from Soroptimist of Woodland as part of our Ruby Award program.

The Live Your Dream Education and Training Award (formerly Women's Opportunity Award) was established to assist women who have overcome significant hardships and shoulder the primary financial responsibility for their families to obtain the skills, training, and education necessary to improve their employment status and standard of living for themselves and their family. This year's \$1,000 award winner is Samantha Snider. Samantha experienced challenges and personal setbacks but was able to successfully turn her life around which is a testament to her strength of character and determination to make a better life for her daughter and herself. Samantha is currently attending Cambridge Junior College to become a Medical Assistant, but her ultimate goal is to become a Registered Nurse.

SI Woodland Scholarships and Awards 2014 continued



The Violet Richardson Award is a recognition program for young women ages 14-17 engaged in volunteer action within their communities or schools. The award is given to young women whose activities make the community and world a better place. Recipients receive \$500 and the recipient's charitable organization of choice will also receive \$500. The Evelyn Holland Scholarship honors young women pursuing their education in agriculture, who exemplify



Evelyn Holland's dedication to civic affairs and the advancement of women in socie-

ty. This award's recipient will receive \$1,000. Our Violet Richardson and Evelyn Holland Scholarship were awarded to Mary Mast. While it is unusual to recommend one individual for two awards, the Scholarship Committee found her to be an exceptional individual whose qualifications exceed the criteria for both of the awards. Mary volunteers at several organizations but indicated that organization "closest to her heart" is Friends of Meals on Wheels which will receive a donation in her name SI Woodland as part of the Violet Richardson Award.

Rehan's passion also stems from watching her parents' struggles to provide for their family, as a result of their limited formal education. Rehan overcame adversity in her freshman year and ended her high school years with an outstanding GPA. She plans to transfer from community college to the University of California Davis and obtain a degree and teaching credential. We are confident she will be the enthusiastic and well-trained teacher she aspires to be.
